1: Textual analysis

How is meaning constructed within and through film texts?

• SL 37.5hrs / HL 60hrs

- Key concepts: film language, genre, audience, institution, narrative, representation
- Comment on: narrative, characters & issues, camera angles, shots, editing, lighting, sound, location, genre, target audience, historical & sociocultural factors.

2: Film theory & history

How is film influenced by factors such as history & tradition, social & economic forces or by observations & research?

• SL 37.5hrs / HL 60hrs

- •Students expected to learn about films from more than one country to enhance understanding of familiar and less familiar.
- •Some Q's to ask include: Who made this? What can we tell about the film-maker(s)? For whom was it made? What outside influences can we perceive? To what other works might it be connected?

3. Creative process-techniques & organization of production

Students develop skills in film production working in a variety of roles.

- SL 75hrs / HL 120hrs (alone or in groups of 4 max)
- •Creative Process: planning (R&D), pitch & approval, technical planning (genre, shot selection, schedule), physical production (pre, prod, post).
- Production journal: key information throughout entire process.
- •Copyright: Student work must not contain third party © material.

- Rationale: ≤ 100 words

- Based on: study of **minimum of 4 films** from more than one country.
- Rationale: ≤ 100 words Script: 12-15 pages
- Marks: 25

Oral Presentation

25%

- Detailed critical analysis of continuous extract from a prescribed film.
- Extract: ≤ 5 minutes Presentation: ≤ 15 mins
- Marks: 25

INTERNAL

Production Portfolio

50%

- One completed film project with associated trailer and written documentation connecting both ≤ 1,750 words
- Film length: 6-7 mins including titles
- Trailer length: 40-60 seconds
- Rationale for both trailer & film: ≤ 100 words each
- Marks: 50

NB: If undertaken in a group, all documentation must be individually produced. SL & HL students may work in the same production group but may not present the same edit due to the different assessment requirements.
